

Pet First Aid Kits Project - DUE MONDAY

Directions: listed below are the components of a fully stocked Pet First Aid Kit. Your job will be to make your own first aid kit that includes all of the items shown below. You do not actually have to make a kit with these actual items. Instead, you may choose to make a “hypothetical” kit in which you represent these items with something that is similar to it or a picture you draw. BE CREATIVE!

If you create or draw the items they should be labeled and look like the actual objects.

However, you may also choose to make an actual kit. If you choose to do so, and you include all or most of the real items listed below, your grade will be rounded to the next letter grade (if you already received an A, you will receive an extra 5% on your grade). Because a pet first aid kit is an essential part of owning any pet, you should try to create an actual kit that you could keep at home. However, if obtaining these items is too expensive or difficult in the time allowed, paper pictures, models or cutouts of these items will be acceptable as well.

Kits with actual items may be submitted at a later date for an increased grade, but a substitute hypothetical kit should then be submitted by the deadline.

The items you should include in your kit are (you may add other things if you would like):

- Muzzle (Bought or Material)
- Absorbent Pad
- Hydrogen Peroxide or Disinfectant
- Gauze / Bandaging
- Topical Antibiotic Ointment
- Scissors
- Tweezers
- Thermometer
- Grooming Clippers*
- Cold Pack
- Leash
- Emergency Numbers

*Clippers can be very expensive – should you make a real kit but include a photo of clippers that is acceptable.

Grading will follow the rubric below:

Appearance	Appearance is professional, neat, and appealing	Effort went into appearance, but more could be done.	Minimal effort put into appearance
Effort	The student clearly cared about making this project presentable	The student put effort into the project but more could have been done.	Minimal effort put into project as a whole.
Timeliness	Project was handed in on time	Project was a day late (without a cleared excuse).	Project was two or more days late.
